

Introduction



Primary organizations

Organizations	Responsibility
Royal Forest Department (RFD)	-managing forest areas categorized as National Reserve Forest (National Reserve Forest Act B.E. 2507) and protected areas under Forest Act B.E. 2484.
Forest Industry Organization (FIO)	-managing production plantation areas under RFD.
75 Provincial Natural Resources and Environment Offices	-facilitating Plantation management in private lands.
Department of National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries and Plant Conservation (DNP)	-managing protected areas categorized as National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries

Forest laws

There are six forest laws being employed to regulate the forest activities

- 1. Forest Act B.E. 2484 (1941) and subsequent amendment B.E. 2532 (1989)
- 2. National Park Act B.E. 2504 (1961)
- 3. National Reserve Forest Act B.E. 2507 (1964) and subsequent amendments, B.E. 2522 (1979) and B.E. 2528 (1985)
- 4. Wildlife Preservation and Protection Act B.E. 2535(1992)
- 5. Forest Plantation Act B.E. 2535 (1992)
- Chainsaw Act B.E. 2545 (2002)

C&I for legality of timber

6 Principles

- 1. Operator's obligations to ensure the legality of land
- 2. Operator's timber sourcing and transportation obligations.
- Operator's forest management obligations in harvesting practices
- 4. Operator's workplace and social obligations
- 5. Operator's tax, fee and other payment obligations
- 6. Operator's environment safeguard obligations

Forest Management Certification


- Forest Industry Organization (FIO)
 - Receives certification from Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) for Teak Plantations managed by them.
- 75 Provincial Natural Resources and Environment Offices
 - Issues certification under the Forest Plantation Act B.E. 2535
 (1992) for Private Plantation Management
 companies/Individuals


Legality assurance systems

Operation of Thailand Timber Tracking System


- Electronic-Timber Tracking System (e-TTS) was set up in 2010 to control, track back and cross check between check points of RFD.
- RFD's mainframe can manage data transfer online by network.
- The e-TTS new system uses latest computerized software.
- Data arrangement, monitoring and reporting along the chain of custody use computerized analysis, which are not only accurate but also faster than the paper-based system
